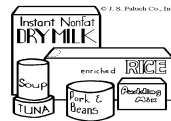

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en el Señor, los fieles de Brooklyn y Queens,

Nuestra fe está centrada en la Eucaristía y en la Palabra de Dios. El Concilio Vaticano II nos ha recordado que la Liturgia es la "fuente y cumbre" de la vida de la Iglesia. Esta presupuesta a iniciar nuestra semana, enviándonos hacia una misión en el mundo. Es la fuente de nuestra vida - la vida de Dios en nosotros. También debería ser esa meta O cumbre hacia donde aspiramos llegar. Participamos en la Liturgia para dar culto, para recibir la Gracia de Dios y acercamos a Él y para unimos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas a través del Sacramento.

Hoy en día en nuestras parroquias, sacerdotes a menudo celebran Misas cada semana en más de un idioma, a menudo esforzándose para celebrar en un idioma que no es el propio. Este es un reto especialmente para las homilias (como también en el trabajo pastoral individual de consejería O en la Confesión). Buscamos dar la bienvenida a los inmigrantes y en lo posible, sacerdotes han aprendido el idioma necesario en su comunidad específica para servir a los recién llegados. Como ustedes saben, la población cambia constantemente en nuestra diócesis de Brooklyn y Queens; una Misa en otro idioma que hace 30 años pudo haber sido esencial en alguna parroquia, podría no ser necesaria actualmente.

Permítanme compartir con ustedes algunas estadísticas:

En 1995, la asistencia a Misa en nuestra diócesis fue reportada en un promedio de 286,000 personas cada fin de semana. En 2016, el promedio reportado fue de 220,000. Esto representa una disminución de casi el 23 por ciento en los últimos 21 años. Este descenso en la asistencia a Misa indica que en algunas parroquias tenemos templos de gran capacidad pero una asistencia a Misa significativamente reducida.

En aquellos tiempos, había un mayor número de sacerdotes que vivían y trabajaban en nuestras parroquias. Debido a un gran número de jubilaciones y fallecimientos de sacerdotes en los últimos años, hay menos presbíteros sirviendo por parroquia. Esto se traduce en un gran aumento en las demás responsabilidades de nuestros sacerdotes.

Además, el reducido número de miembros del clérigo con habilidades bilingües complica aún más la capacidad de servir bien en las parroquias con necesidades lingüísticas específicas.

No hay solución simple a este problema. En la mayoría de nuestras parroquias es evidente que no necesitamos tantas Misas separadas para acomodar el número de feligreses que asisten a la Misa dominical cada semana. En muchas situaciones, parece claro que una reducción en el número de Misas de fin de semana es necesaria. Un ajuste en el horario de la Misa puede fortalecer a la comunidad, aumentando la participación en las Misas restantes. Verdaderamente queremos reunir a nuestra gente.

Le estoy pidiendo a todos los párrocos y administradores de nuestra diócesis de Brooklyn y Queens, que, en consulta con sus consejos pastorales, revisen y evalúen sus horarios de Misa. En la mayoría de las parroquias, podría reducirse el número de Misas celebradas cada fin de semana, al menos por una O más Misas, dependiendo del número de asistentes y de la capacidad de cada iglesia.

Además, quiero pedir que haya una coordinación de horarios con las parroquias vecinas. De manera especial, pido que haya por lo menos una Misa dominical en la noche en cada decanato, para acomodar a aquellos fieles que debido a otras obligaciones no pueden ir a Misa el sábado por la noche o el domingo en la mañana,

Se que algunos feligreses se verán directamente afectados cuando estos cambios se lleven a cabo en el horario de Misas de fin de semana. Ningún cambio es fácil. Pero nuestra esperanza es tener celebraciones eucarísticas más animadas y llenas de gozo, atrayendo a un mayor número de fieles para que vengan a dar gracias y alabanzas a Dios. Les pido su paciencia y su comprensión mientras se realicen estos ajustes en los horarios de su parroquia. También les pido que por favor hagan los sacrificios personales necesarios para unirse a sus hermanas y hermanos en la Eucaristía del fin de semana. Debemos tener en cuenta que todo lo que hacemos como Iglesia, lo debemos hacer para la gloria y alabanza de Dios.

Como mencione anteriormente, la Liturgia es la fuente y la cumbre de la vida de la Iglesia. A medida que avanzamos con esta iniciativa de examinar nuestro horario de Misa del fin de semana, mi oración es que podamos aumentar la participación de nuestro pueblo, no solo en la celebración de la Eucaristía, sino también en todos los demás aspectos de la vida parroquial.

Le pido a los párrocos y administradores que envíen sus cambios propuestos directamente a su Vicario Territorial y juntos los evaluaremos. Mi esperanza es recibir estas propuestas en un futuro cercano, Estoy consciente que algunas intenciones de Misas ya han sido asignadas.

Gracias de antemano por su comprensión y con la garantía de mi constante recuerdo de ustedes en mis oraciones y en la celebración de la Eucaristía, yo soy

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord, the faithful of Brooklyn and Queens,

Our faith is centered on the Eucharist and God's Word. Vatican II reminded us that the Liturgy is the "source and summit" of the life of the Church. It is meant to start our week, sending us out on mission to the world. It is the source of our life - God's life in us. It also should be that high point or summit towards which we aim. We participate in the Liturgy to worship and to receive God's Grace, to draw close to God and join together with our brothers and sisters through the sacrament.

In our parishes today, priests often celebrate Masses each week in more than one language, often working to celebrate in a language not their own. That is a challenge especially for homilies (as it also is in one-to-one pastoral work such as counseling or Confession). We seek to welcome the immigrant and where possible, priests have learned the language needed in their specific community in order to serve the newcomers. As you know, the demographics change rather rapidly in our diocese in Brooklyn and Queens; a language Mass that might have been essential in a parish 30 years ago could be serving few attendees today.

Allow me to share with you some statistics:

In 1995, Mass attendance in our Diocese was reported at an average of 286,000 people per weekend. In 2016, the average was reported at 220,000. That represents a decrease of nearly 23 percent in the last 21 years. This decline in Mass attendance means that in some parishes we have large capacity churches and a significantly reduced Mass size.

At that time, there was a higher number of priests living and working in our parishes. Due to a large number of priest retirements and deaths in recent years, there are fewer priests serving per parish. This results in overextending the other responsibilities of our priests.

Also, the reduced number of clergy with bilingual skills further complicates the ability to best serve parishes with specific language needs.

There is no simple solution to this issue. In most of our parishes it is evident that we do not need so many separate Masses to accommodate the number of parishioners in attendance at Sunday Eucharist each week. In many situations, it seems clear that a reduction in the number of weekend Masses is necessary. An adjustment in the Mass schedule can strengthen the community, increasing participation in the remaining Masses. Truly, we wish to bring our people together.

I am asking pastors and administrators throughout the diocese in Brooklyn and Queens, in consultation with their pastoral councils, to review and evaluate their Mass schedules. In most parishes, the number of Masses celebrated each weekend could be reduced by at least one or more Masses, depending on the number of people attending and the capacity of each church.

Additionally, I would ask that there be some coordination of schedules with neighboring parishes. In a special way, I ask that there be at least one Sunday evening Mass within each deanery, to accommodate those faithful who due to other obligations may not be able to attend a Saturday evening or Sunday morning Mass.

I know that some parishioners will be directly affected when these changes take place in the Weekend Mass schedule. Change is never easy. But our hope is to encourage more vibrant, joyful celebrations of (he Eucharist, bringing larger numbers of the faithful together to give thanks and praise to God. I ask for your patience and understanding as adjustments are made to your parish schedules. I also ask you to please make the personal sacrifices which may be required to join together with your sisters and brothers at the weekend Eucharist. We must keep in mind that everything we do as Church, we do for the praise and glory of God.

As previously mentioned, the Liturgy is the source and summit of the life of the Church. As we move forward with this initiative of examining our weekend Mass schedules, my prayer is that we may increase the involvement of our people, not only in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, but also in all other aspects of parish life.

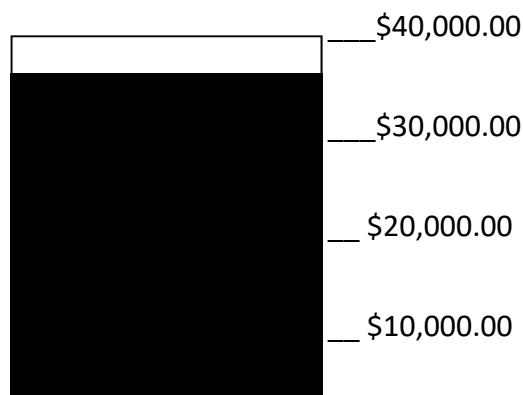
